EASING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS

From the 22nd October, as things stand though still subject to confirmation, the Government plans to ease current restrictions. This will probably effect:
 • Restrictions on numbers
 • Social distancing

However, we envisage the following measures will remain in place in church for the next while:
 • Wearing mask covering nose & mouth while inside
 • Sanitising hands on entry and exit
 • Church doors will also need to be left open to provide the necessary ventilation
 • No holy water font use
 • Communion still to be taken on the hand

We do anticipate the following will soon be allowed:
 • Lighting of church candles at shrines
 • Phased safe return of the church choirs
 • Phased return of Adoration Prayer in Garristown

At meal times invite anyone at the table to say a Grace before meals or a simple prayer of thanksgiving to God.

DIOCESAN SYNODAL PATHWAY
 For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission

In these days, the Catholic Church throughout the world and in Ireland is beginning a series of conversations about what God wants of God's people at this time. These conversations are often referred to as a Synodal Process. "Synodal" comes from a Greek word which means "walking together".

This Sunday, 17th October, will mark the opening of this Synodal Process with a gathering in the **Pro Cathedral at 3pm** led by Archbishop Farrell. (A link to join by webcam is on our website: www.pastoralareagnr.com) This Synodal Process coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people, both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

You may wish to pray regularly for the success of this journey towards a renewed way of being Church together.

Prayer for the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus
 This prayer was prayed each day of the Second Vatican Council.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.
